Foreign Tax Credits

The International Growth Fund, Developing Markets Growth Fund, and the Global Dividend Growth Fund have paid taxes imposed by foreign countries and deducted such amounts in computing their incomes. The Funds will elect not to "pass-through" foreign tax credits to the shareholders.

Form 1099-R for Distributions

If you made a withdrawal from your IRA or converted a Traditional IRA to a Roth IRA in 2014, your Form 1099-R will be mailed separately by January 31, 2015.

Form 5498 for Contributions

In May 2015, we will send a Form 5498 to you showing your IRA contributions for the 2014 tax year.

Traditional IRA - Contributions may be tax-deductible depending upon your circumstances. There is a limit of \$5,500 per person per tax year (\$6,500 if you were 50 by December 31, 2014). Contributions for the 2014 tax year must be made no later than April 15, 2015.

Roth IRA - Contributions are not tax-deductible and are limited to \$5,500 per person per tax year (\$6,500 if you were 50 by December 31, 2014). Contributions for the 2014 tax year must be made no later than April 15, 2015.

Coverdell Education Savings Account (former known as an Education IRA) - Contributions are not tax-deductible and are limited to \$2,000 per minor per tax year. Contributions for the 2014 tax year must be made no later than April 15, 2015.
